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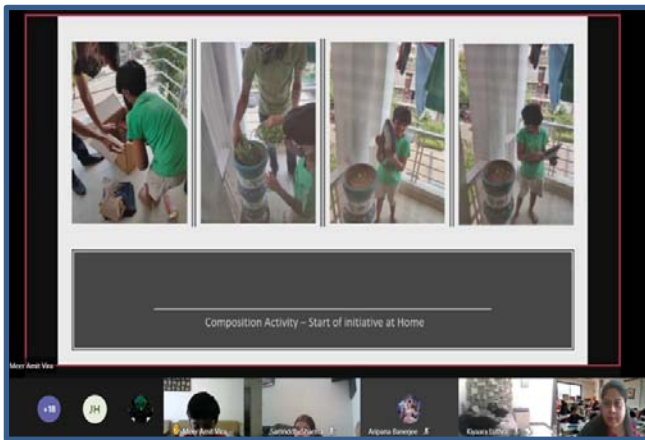

Next, as we head into November, we will dive deeper into learning all about our green leader of the month – *John Muir*, who is also often called as 'The Father of National Parks'.

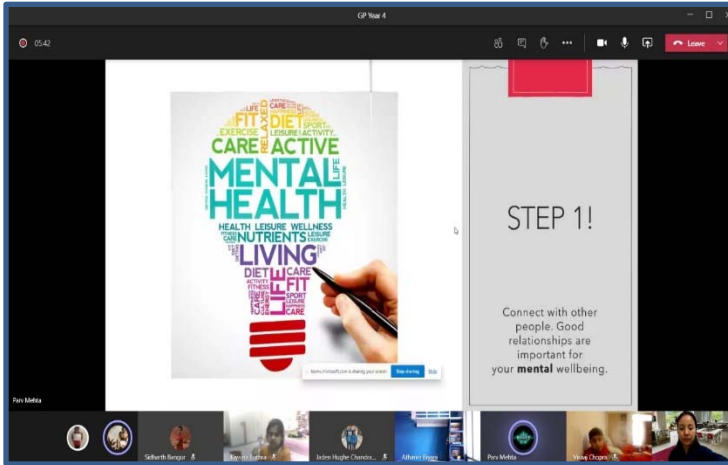

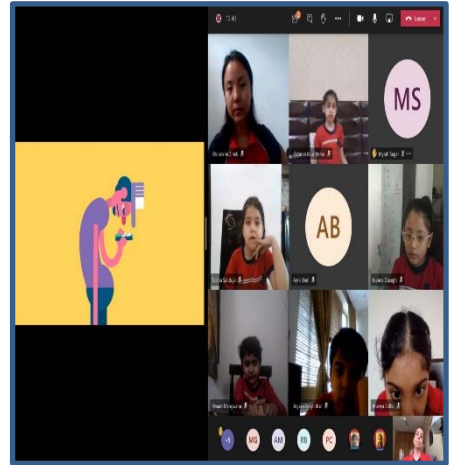
**Drama Year 1 – scences from ‘A very hungry caterpillar’ on Drama Day**
